Peter <i>(& the apostles)</i>	The crucifixion, resurrection and exaltation of Jesus; Salvation is through repentance and belief.	Jerusalem <i>(high priestly family)</i>	65 words	5:29-32
Stephen	A historical survey of Israel's refusal to submit to Yahweh's purposes for them.	Jerusalem <i>(Sanhedrin)</i>	1,235 words	7:2-53
Peter	The crucified, risen Jesus is judge of all, and offers forgiveness through faith in Him.	Caesarea <i>(a Gentile household)</i>	223 words	10:34-43
Paul	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jesus is the fulfillment of Yahweh's purposes for Israel and the Jews. • Salvation is by faith in the work of the crucified, risen Messiah, Jesus. 	Pisidian Antioch	568 words	13:16-41
Paul	The sovereign creator God made all of mankind for Himself and will judge the world by the man whom He appointed (Jesus).	Mars Hill in Athens	264 words	17:22-31
Paul	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rehearses his 3-year ministry to the Ephesian church. • Warns the elders to be attentive to themselves and their flock against false teachers. • Be servant givers to the ministry. 	Miletus <i>(to the elders of the Ephesian church)</i>	432 words	20:18-36
Paul	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gives testimony of his past devotion to Judaism <i>and</i> his miracu-lous conversion on the road. • Reminds his Jewish listeners of his long and hateful opposition to the Gospel. • Testifies that God's current purpose for him is to preach to the Gentiles rather than the Jews. 	Jerusalem <i>(angry mob of Jews)</i>	500 words	22:1-21
Paul	Testifies to the fact that his hope and faith are in the resurrection of the dead—the same hope of every Jew.	Caesarea <i>(before Felix, a Roman governor)</i>	259 words	24:10-21
Paul	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The resurrection of the dead is the hope of Israel. • Paul's previous fanaticism against Jesus was well known among Jews. • Testifies about his experience on the road to Damascus. • Connects his message and faith to that of Moses and the prophets—the salvation of all mankind. 	Caesarea <i>(Festus, Herod Agrippa & Bernice)</i>	720 words	26:2-29
Paul	(after preaching all day about Jesus from Moses and the prophets) Paul confronts the Jews with their blindness and reiterates God's call on his life to preach to the Gentiles.	Rome <i>(Jewish leaders)</i>	173 words <i>(recorded)</i>	28:23-29
